

## THE SPIRIT IS AN INVISIBLE BODY

The invisible spirit is a scientific construct of reason, an applied intelligence that serves as an explorer of space and the cosmic consciousness of the universe, and of the spirit of consciousness—a full and clear awareness of delving deep into our soul.

Reason, the driving force behind all human development, is the creativity of knowledge, of beauty, and of the emotional essence of consciousness. Thought is the command over the realm of matter and creation, which develops the vibrant breath of every pulse of cosmic and spiritual energy. Faith is a journey in which the soul steps forth to confront the experiences of the spirit; the separation of body and soul is the root of all doubt in our quest to attain the certainty that our very essence is defined by the spirit underpinning every emotion and every thought of our true life, right up to our rebirth. The spirit is the perceptible emotion of the infinite, which sets in motion the second phase of unmoving time. Man possesses many resources to advance the knowledge of truth and to make his existence more humane; among these, philosophy stands out as contributing directly to the construction of the meaning of life, one of humanity's noble tasks. Indeed, philosophy was born the moment man began to question the why of things and their purpose. Indeed, every people possesses its own wisdom, the true wealth of philosophical culture. Let us not forget that reason, too, must be upheld in the quest for one's life's choice, so that we may encounter the truth in the sustainability of faith and historical rationalism, and thereby find ourselves. We must ensure we possess the capacity and discernment to grasp the authentic message of spirit and reason, bringing together science and faith, in a landscape where pitfalls abound: to love what we do not know and to speak of what we have seen, the cosmos and the life of faith move in the same direction.
